Historic San Angelo

History

San Angelo's rich history weaves together centuries of Native American, Texan, and Pioneer culture. Today, thanks to a tradition of preservation, San Angelo's history is very much alive and proudly on display.

Fort Concho

This national landmark was established as an Army outpost in 1867, and served to protect burgeoning West Texas settlements. Once home to the famed Buffalo Soldiers, Fort Concho is considered one of the nation's best



preserved Indian Wars forts, and is part of the Texas Forts Trail program. The museum and grounds are open Monday through Sunday, and periodically feature living history demonstrations.

Historic Downtown

Discover unique shops, historical buildings and museums, and murals by artists' Crystal Goodman and Stylee Read depicting the city's early modes of transportation, blacksmithing and West Texas ranching heritage as well as a tribute to Elmer Kelton, award winning novelist.

Old Town

Located at El Paseo de Santa Angela, this designated historic district showcases vintage architecture from the 1880s to the early 1900s. Tour the Camunez Grocery Store, Victorian residences, and homes and businesses designed by Oscar Ruffini, San Angelo's pioneer architect.

The Concho Pearl

Unique to the waters of West Texas, natural Concho pearls have been coveted for centuries because of their alluring pink and purple hues. It is even rumored that the Spanish crown jewels contain these exquisite gems. The pearls, which make treasured gifts and keepsakes, can be found in jewelry shops around San Angelo.

Miss Hattie's Bordello Museum

The ladies of Miss Hattie's entertained San Angelo's gentlemen for fifty years, before the bordello was closed



in 1946 by the Texas Rangers. Today, you can tour Miss Hattie's for a glimpse of one of the more colorful outposts of the Wild West.

The Cactus Hotel

Built in 1929 by Conrad Hilton, this grand hotel was a most ambitious and expensive venture. Newly renovated and transformed into San Angelo's cultural center, the Cactus Hotel still features the lavish decorations and crystal ballroom of its past. It is also host to the city's annual Cactus Music Series.

Historic Santa Fe Depot & Railway Museum

The Railway Museum is located in the beautifully restored 1909 Orient-Santa Fe Depot. Tour the permanent railcar collection or view the railroad artifacts and memorabilia on display for a glimpse into San Angelo's past.

Cultural Attractions

San Angelo is alive with culture. Enjoy our year-round presentations of world-class music, theater, fine arts, local artisans, plus downhome favorites like country & blues, dancing, and folk art.

Concho Avenue

Head on by Historic Block One located on Concho Avenue for an eclectic mix of shopping and dining, including jewelers, a general store, an antique mall, and a tearoom.



River Stage

The Bill Aylor Sr. Memorial River Stage showcases a broad spectrum of events, including touring musicals, dance reviews, pop concerts, youth shows, and the annual Cactus Jazz and Blues Festival in September.

SAMFA

Adjacent to the River Stage lies the new 30,000 square foot San Angelo Museum of Fine Arts — home to a renowned permanent collection and the site of diverse traveling exhibitions.

San Angelo Symphony

Since 1949, the San Angelo Symphony has presented world-class performances throughout the year. The annual Multi-Chem July 3rd Pops Concert is the second largest 4th of July celebration in Texas.

San Angelo Civic Theatre

A tradition since 1885, the Angelo Civic Theatre has delighted generations of residents and visitors with a wide variety of stage productions.

Paint Brush Alley

For a one-of-a-kind art experience, visit San Angelo's Alley Scapes – a collection of murals that range from whimsy to nostalgia. Simply park your car and walk through.

Chicken Farm Art Center

This unique compound of galleries, studios, restaurants, and a bed and breakfast features works by visual artists of all mediums, and hosts colorful events and workshops.

ASU Planetarium

The fourth largest university planetarium in the country features dazzling programs throughout most of the year.

Outdoor Attractions

From a gorgeous display of water lilies to the River Walk along the Concho River to one of the largest university planetariums in the nation, San Angelo offers an abundance of natural beauty for your enjoyment.

International Water Lily Garden

The International Water Lily Garden is a brilliant display of lilies from around the world – including the Victoria, the world's largest water lily.



Painted Rocks

Visit the Campbell's Ranch at Paint Rock, Texas to view San Angelo's oldest artifacts – 1,000 year-old Indian Pictographs.

River Walk

Considered one of the most impressive landmarks in the city, the San Angelo River Walk is packed with activity. It features beautiful gardens, the Bill Aylor Sr. Memorial River Stage, a four-mile jogging/walking trail, and a nine-hole golf course, all in downtown San Angelo.

Outdoor Activities

With wide open wilderness for hunting – including deer, turkey, antelope, javelina, quail, dove, and exotic game – plus fishing, horseback riding, biking, or just plain relaxing, San Angelo is an outdoorsman's dream come true.

San Angelo Nature Center

This regional museum and learning center, located at gorgeous Lake Nasworthy, features lush nature displays, hiking trails and a small collection of live animals.



San Angelo State Park

With 7,500 acres of wide-open wilderness, there's plenty of room for virtually any activity under the sun –or even on the water. Regular herd viewing of Bison and Longhorns delight wildlife enthusiasts year-round. And prehistoric dinosaur tracks bring out the paleontologist in everyone.

Boating & Fishing

Any boater, skier or fisherman can find what they're looking for at either Lake Nasworthy or Twin Buttes Reservoir. Canoeists may opt for the placid, winding waters of the three local rivers. And throughout the year, drag boat racing, skiing exhibitions, wakeboarding tournaments and fishing tournaments provide excitement for participants and spectators.

Golf

Golfers of all levels can enjoy a mix of scenic private and public golf courses as diverse as San Angelo's landscape.

Hunting

San Angelo is an outdoor enthusiast's paradise. Home to some of the state's best hunting opportunities for white-tailed deer, pronghorn antelope, Rio Grande turkey, quail, dove, and seasonal waterfowl. Local ranches even offer exotic game hunts.

Birding

With a varied habitat for birding including farm and ranch lands, lakes, streams and hills, San Angelo is home to over 300 species confirmed since 1980. The Hummer House, located in the nearby town of Christoval, is famous for the hummingbirds that migrate there each spring.

Cycling

San Angelo's varied terrain makes it an ideal location for cyclists of all levels. Choose between open roads and smooth wilderness paths for leisurely rides, or rugged hills and challenging mountain bike trails for serious cycling. San Angelo also hosts regional competitions throughout the year.

The San Angelo Colts professional baseball team has called Foster Field at Angelo State University home since 1999. Their games always make for a good time at the ballpark.



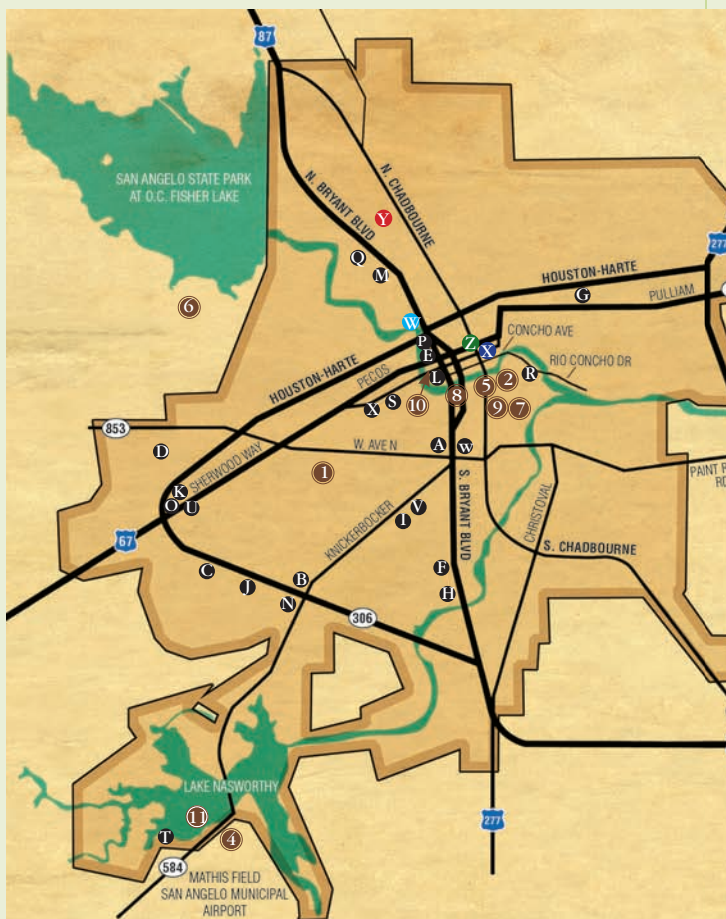

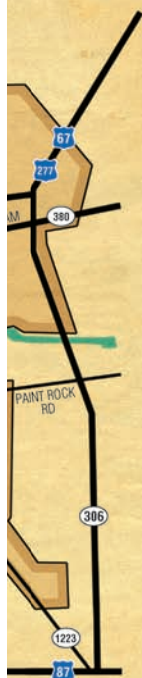
